Trex Soft Plastic Recycling Program

The Township has partnered with Trex, a leading manufacturer of composite lumber, to recycle soft plastic material (i.e. plastic bags, bubble wrap, bread bags, produce bags, shrink wrap, etc.) and keep the items out of landfills. The Recycling Center is a drop off location on Saturdays from 9:00-11:30 a.m. and there is also a collection bin located in the meeting room of the Municipal Building.

Each collection period is six months in duration. The collected plastic is weighed and if we exceed 1000 pounds of plastic in the collection period Trex donates a composite bench. We earned our first bench in the fall of 2019 within the first six weeks of starting the program! Our second six-month collection period began in January and we're well on our way to earning another bench.

The community participation in this program continues to be phenomenal !

Permits need to be filled out Prior to any work that is to be done.


Remember, permits are required if you are planning a new driveway or plan on having your existing driveway repaved with a new layer of blacktop. Permits are required to ensure that all driveway safely provide access to and from the roadways and that any drainage issues that may be present are corrected before a driveway is resurfaced.

Permits are required for accessory structures without plumbing & sewage plus UCC permit fees, when applicable for: Garage, Carport, Shed, Deck, Patio, Gazebo, Pool, Fence, Greenhouse (non-commercial), Residential Chicken Coop.

If you are planning to dig, you must call 811 at least three business days before you start the work. Business days means any day except a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.

Every April marks the beginning of **Safe Digging Month** aligning with the start of spring when outdoor projects typically commence.

Essential reminder for both excavators and homeowners to contact 811 at least three business days before starting any digging. By following this important step, individuals can ensure facility owners and operators accurately locate and mark underground lines, reducing the risk of accidental damage. By proactively contacting 811, an excavator not only prevent injuries but also reduce the risk of disruptive utility outages, underscoring the crucial role of safety and responsibility in excavation practices.



Jefferson Township Recreation Complex

Community Improvement for all to enjoy.


2012, Jefferson Township purchased the 42-acre complex with a desire to provide more recreational opportunities for residents. Phase I of development consisted of the installation of a paved parking area at the trailhead, situated just off Route 348 and construction of more than 1300 feet of new trail, which connects to a former logging road leading to a pond which is on the recreation complex.

2015, the master plan was completed with input from community survey.

2019, Phase 1 trail opening and parking area opening: Jefferson Township celebrated Independence Day 2019 by cutting the ribbon on a new place to walk, run and enjoy the outdoors. The first phase of the trail is ADA accessible and a small parking area is available at the trailhead, located on Community Drive (off of Route 348 near Ritter's Farm Market).

The first phase of this project cost approximately \$78,000 and was made possible by a grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development. The trail is a great addition to our community and was enjoyed by residents through the remainder of 2019.

Recreation Complex Continues



2024 to present– Phase 2 under construction utilizing \$300,000 American Rescue Funds matched with \$300,000 DCNR Grant to complete perimeter trail network, install comfort station, and install 2 multi-purpose fields.

The Jefferson Township Road Department is tasked with maintaining all of the township roads. Some of the responsibilities of the road department in the winter months include keeping the roads free of snow and ice to ensure safe passage of all vehicles. In the warmer months the road department maintains signage, fills potholes, trims trees, mows shoulder vegetation, and maintains the road drainage.

Jefferson Township is very proud to have many tools and equipment ready to go for any emergencies and maintenance that may come up. We maintain 4 plow trucks, backhoe, excavator, skid steer loader, chipper, roller, mowers and service truck. In an effort to maintain the best fleet this year we have added a new 2025 Freightliner plow truck and a used 2013 Peterbilt plow truck, 2025 tilt top equipment trailer and John Deere 930Z zero turn mower.
